Sanctions – Graduated approach

Stage 1	Verbal warning
Stage 2	2 minutes 'thinking time' inside the classroom in a quiet area away from other children
Stage 3	5 minutes 'thinking time' (as above)
Stage 4	10 minutes with a Phase Leader and a behaviour letter will be sent home.
Stage 5	Rest of the day suspension within school in a partner class. The class teacher sends the child to the partner class with work to be completed. Parents will be notified and invited in for discussion with the class teacher and a member of SLT.

Children will be supported through an individual behaviour plan where necessary in consultation with parents.

End of school – 5pm £7.52



Uniform


We have high expectations of uniform and expect the children to be in the correct uniform at all times to show pride in our Coppice identity. Spot checks on uniform are done each week.
