# Sanctions – Graduated approach

| Stage 1 | Verbal warning  |
|---------|---|
| Stage 2 | 2 minutes 'thinking time' inside the classroom in a quiet area away from other children   |
| Stage 3 | 5 minutes 'thinking time' (as above)  |
| Stage 4 | 10 minutes with a Phase Leader and a behaviour letter will be sent home.  |
| Stage 5 | Rest of the day suspension within school in a partner class. The class teacher sends the child to the partner class with work to be completed. Parents will be notified and invited in for discussion with the class teacher and a member of SLT. |

Children will be supported through an individual behaviour plan where necessary in consultation with parents.

‘The learning environment has developed significantly. Displays are engaging and staff have really worked hard to ensure that the school is somewhere pupils can be proud to attend. Within classrooms, there is evidence of working walls, displays that provide scaffolding and modelling of expectations.’

There is a good ‘feel’ to the school and pupils are clear that this is a ‘reading school’.

‘EAL pupils were well supported within a small group with a native language speaker. This is excellent provision for new arrivals from Hong Kong. This is reflected in positive feedback from parents also.’

8am – start of school £4.77



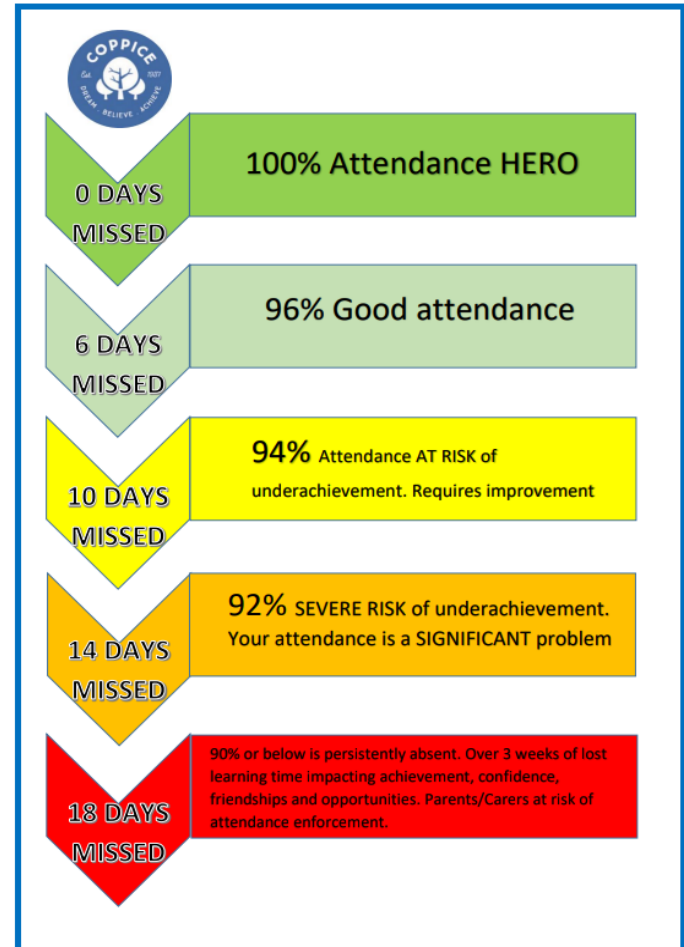
**After School Club** (includes snack at 3:30pm and light tea after 5pm)

# Uniform

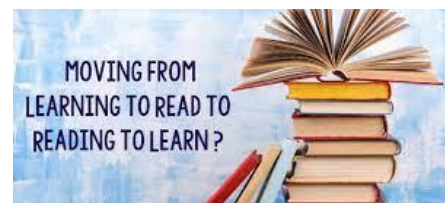
We have high expectations of uniform and expect the children to be in the correct uniform at all times to show pride in our Coppice identity. Spot checks on uniform are done each week.
