

The current Covid-19 Pandemic has meant that children will at times not be able to attend school because either they need to self-isolate, school is closed or will be absent because they have the virus themselves and are ill. This document explains how we will make sure that your child can continue to learn when they are forced to work at home.

If your child is at home ill with Covid 19, or any other illness, they won't be expected to complete any home learning.

There are three different scenarios that mean your child can not access learning in the normal way.

Who is this for?	This is for individual children who can't attend school because a member of their household has tested positive for Covid (they are a contact).	This is for children whose whole class bubble is having to isolate because they are all contacts of a child or staff member in the class who has tested positive. This is every child who is unable to attend school because of a nation-wide extended lockdown closure.	
How will the learning be structured?	As the teacher will still be teaching the rest of the class in school, children will have access to generic daily Reading, Writing and Maths teaching & tasks via: • Web tutorials from the National Oak Academy. • Paper activities provided by school. • Teaching powerpoints and learning activities provided by school on the following day after the school has been informed of a period of isolation. (These will follow the school curriculum as closely as possible to ensure continuity of learning.)	As the whole class will be working from home, the teacher will teach and provide work for the normal lessons. Live teaching (using Teams) 3 sessions daily session. Additional lessons using videos, online platforms such as Oak Academy, powerpoints and prepared activities and worksheets. Additional teams meetings for small group interventions. Lesson coverage which includes daily English, maths and reading lessons, as well as weekly science and other foundation subject lessons, PSHE and PE Links to daily program and activities shared via Teams. Feedback and assessment on learning will occur via: written comments on submitted work, verbal feedback via live lessons, and whole class feedback in live teaching sessions and end of day check-ups.	

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How will my child access the work?	School and the family will come to a join decision about how best to provide your child with work. They will receive tasks to complete in one of the following ways: • Paper copies of work will be available for collection if only the child is isolating. • If the whole family is isolating work will be delivered to the family home. • Work will be sent via Class Dojo	 The expectation is that all pupils attend live lessons using Teams. Support will be given to help parents and pupils attend these lessons. SEN pupils will be supported in smaller groups by Tas/Teachers if required. Some pupils may for individual reasons not be able to access live lessons and will be provided with equivalent resources to ensure continuity of learning
How much online learning will my child be provided with?	Your child will be provided with an English, Maths and reading task. They will be encouraged to use the National oak academy to support this learning.	 Every day your child will be provided with a minimum of 3 hours of work to complete. Most of this will be delivered via 3 live lessons a day. They will be given time for independent work relating to these sessions and other subjects.
If my child does not have digital or online access at home, how will you support them to access remote education?	Paper copies of work will be provided Loaning of laptops if required	We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We take the following approaches to support those pupils to access remote education: • Loaning of laptops if required • Giving a range of methods for sharing their work. Photos shared on class dojo Books supplied so that pupils can keep records of their work until school reopens Task can be saved on teams • Pupils can be provided with printed resources
How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support	 Work provided will be for your child alone so will be tailored to meet their individual learning needs Parents and teachers can contact each other via Class dojo. 	We recognise that some pupils, for example some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home. If engagement with home learning becomes an issue then parents will be contacted via class dojo and offered support. Work will be marked and returned to pupils each day. Registers are taken for each session to help us identify where support is needed 	
Will there be direct teaching or feedback?
